

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You can never find the one you need when you need it! The perfect legal form, that is. We have compiled a list of links to free forms on the internet so you don't have to spend time searching. Still can't find what you're looking for? Try swapping forms with a fellow Paralegal using the "Connect" section of the Gateway.

<u>FindLegalForms.com</u>: Search their database of thousands of free legal forms. Their one of a kind search engine will allow you to easily find the form you are looking for. Select the database from the drop-down menu and enter your search. You can also search their State Specific "Premium Forms" database of over 20,000 non-free legal forms. To find any form, enter your search term, select the free or premium database and press "Find Forms".

<u>Lectric' Law Library:</u> Offering free forms and also non-free premium forms.

<u>FindLaw.com</u>: Database of State Corporate and Business forms (most of these links will redirect you to Secretaries of State's sites.)

Internet Legal Resource Guide: Pretty good site with all free legal forms. Not a huge variety but, it will give you a good starting place.

<u>LegalWiz.com</u>: Small sampling of free forms (some for purchase) and downloadable in .pdf format. Cool website name! It's the Wiz!

MegaLaw.com: Free legal forms organized by subject.

<u>Forms From the Feds:</u> You've got to love this name!! Good site with downloadable government electronic files in .pdf format.

<u>Hudclips</u>: Looking for a HUD form? Click here and find a huge variety in .pdf format.

<u>WashLaw WEB</u>: Cool site with links to forms all over the internet for just about any state.

<u>U. S. Legal Forms</u>: The original and premiere site for legal forms on the Internet. Over 36,000 legal documents and forms, including wills, name change, real estate and more.
